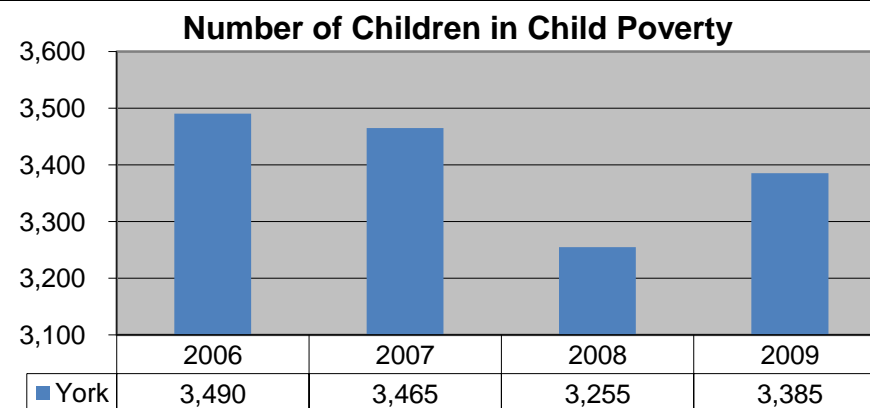
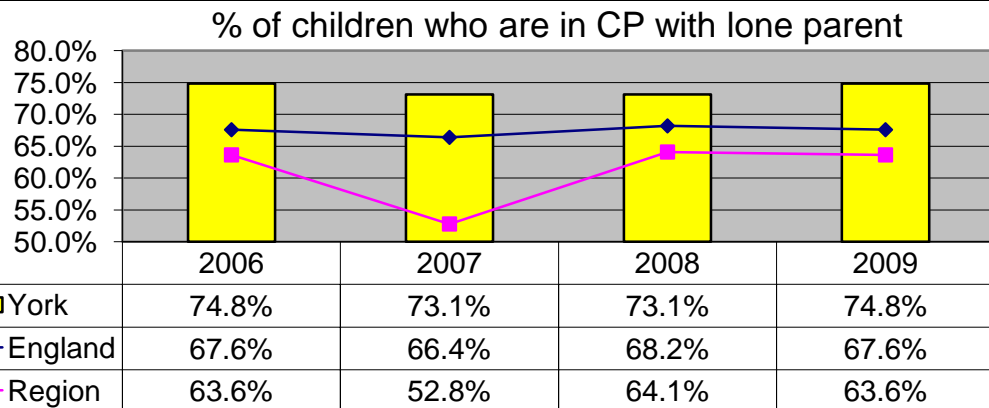
The % of those in child poverty has increased by 0.5% which is in line with regional and national rises.

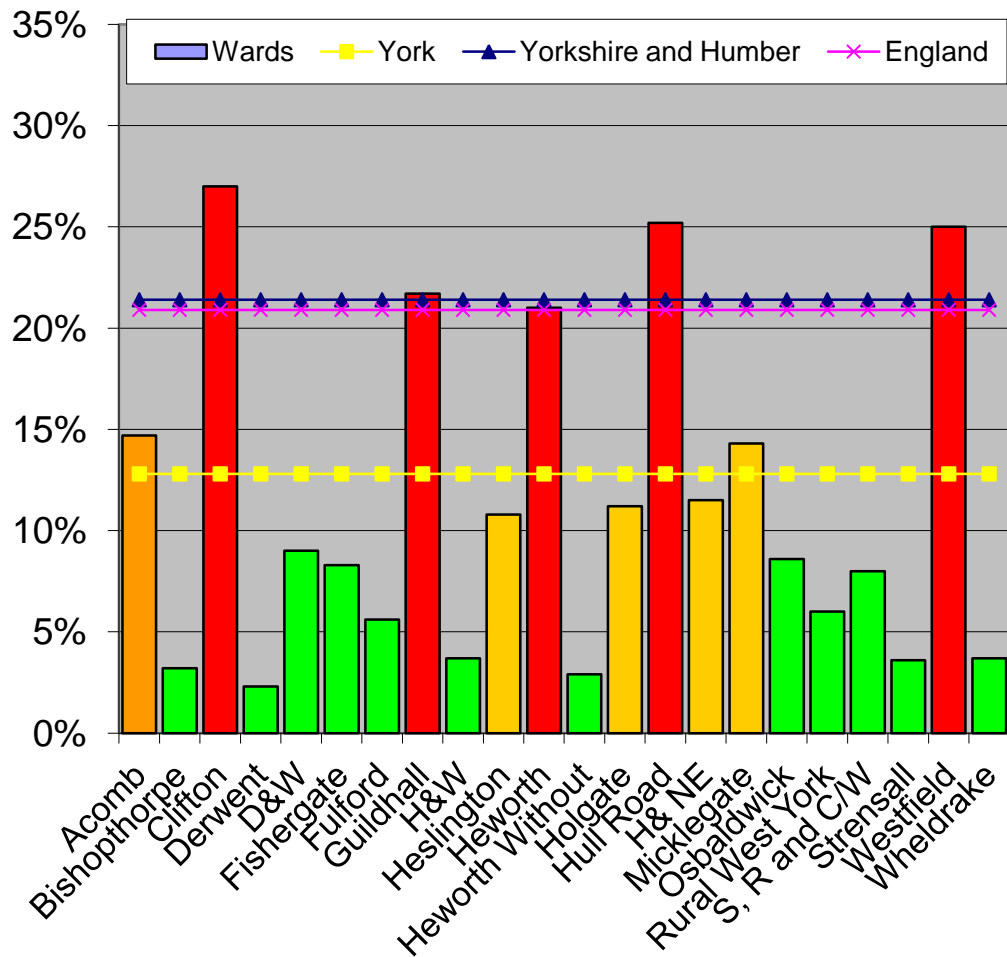

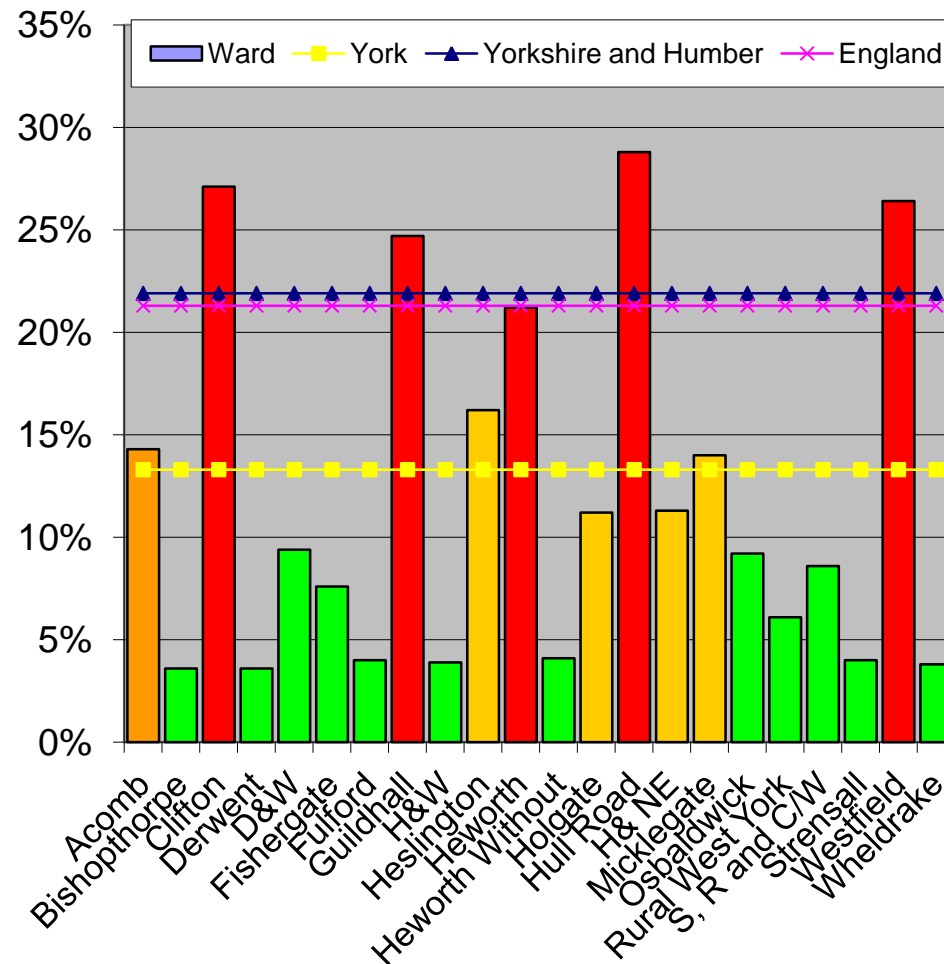
The % of children who live in Child Poverty belonging to a lone parent households has increased to 75% where as the regional and national figures show a decrease.

The number belonging to a lone parent increased by 4% compared to 3.1% regionally and 3% nationally.

Child Poverty by Ward- 2008



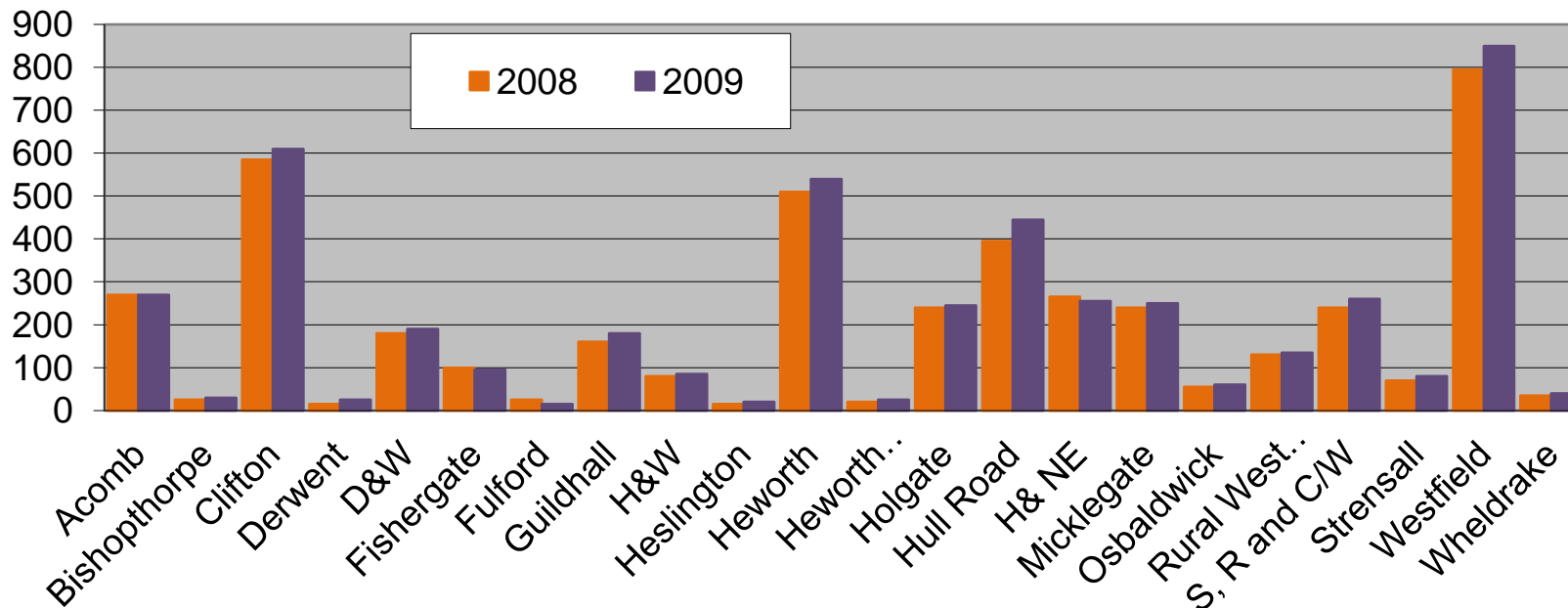
Child Poverty by Ward- 2009



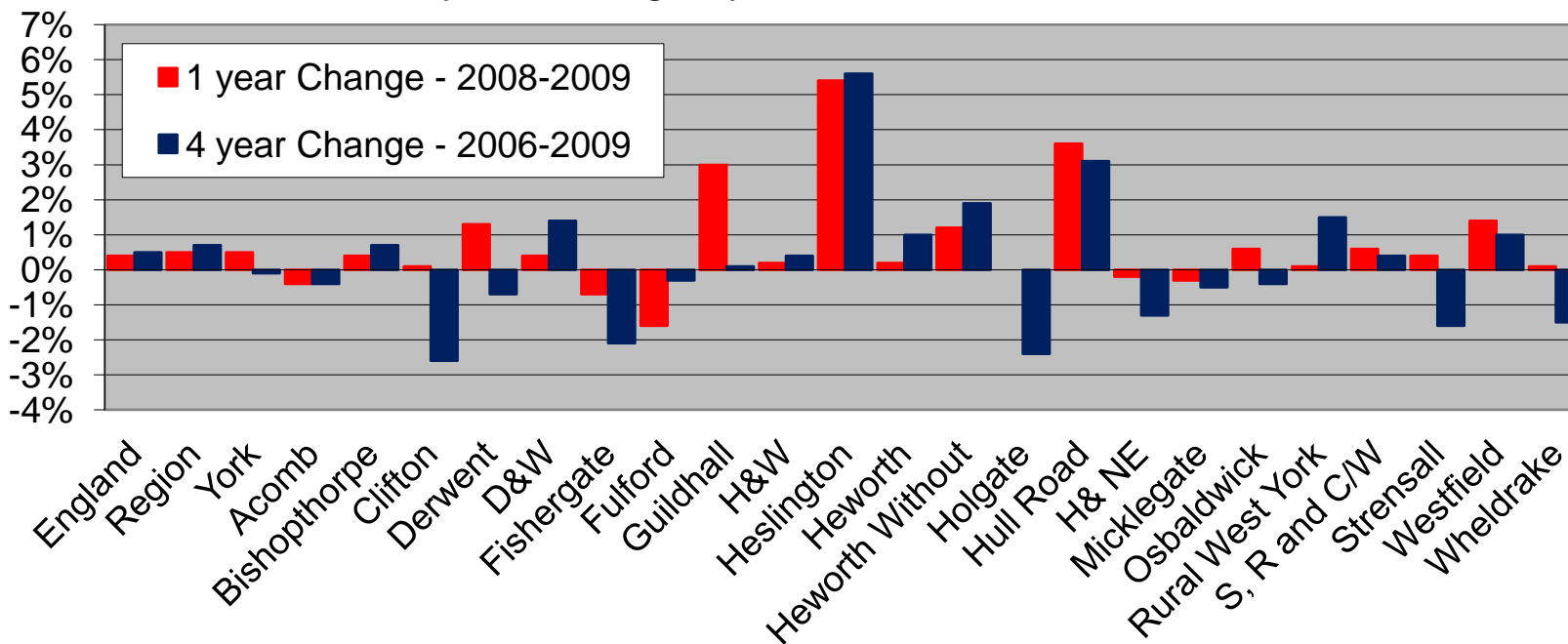
Notes

- the 5 highest wards in 2008 remain the highest in 2009 but with differing results. Although they have all risen Clifton and Heworth have risen less than 0.2%, Westfield has only risen 1.4% but Guildhall and Hull Road have risen 3% and 3.6% respectively.
- We now have 8 wards above the regional level instead of 7.
- The biggest rise comes in Heslington where the number in child poverty has risen 5.2% in one year from 10.8% to 16.2%. However, this only represents 20 children in total. Therefore its important to look at numbers and %. See next page.

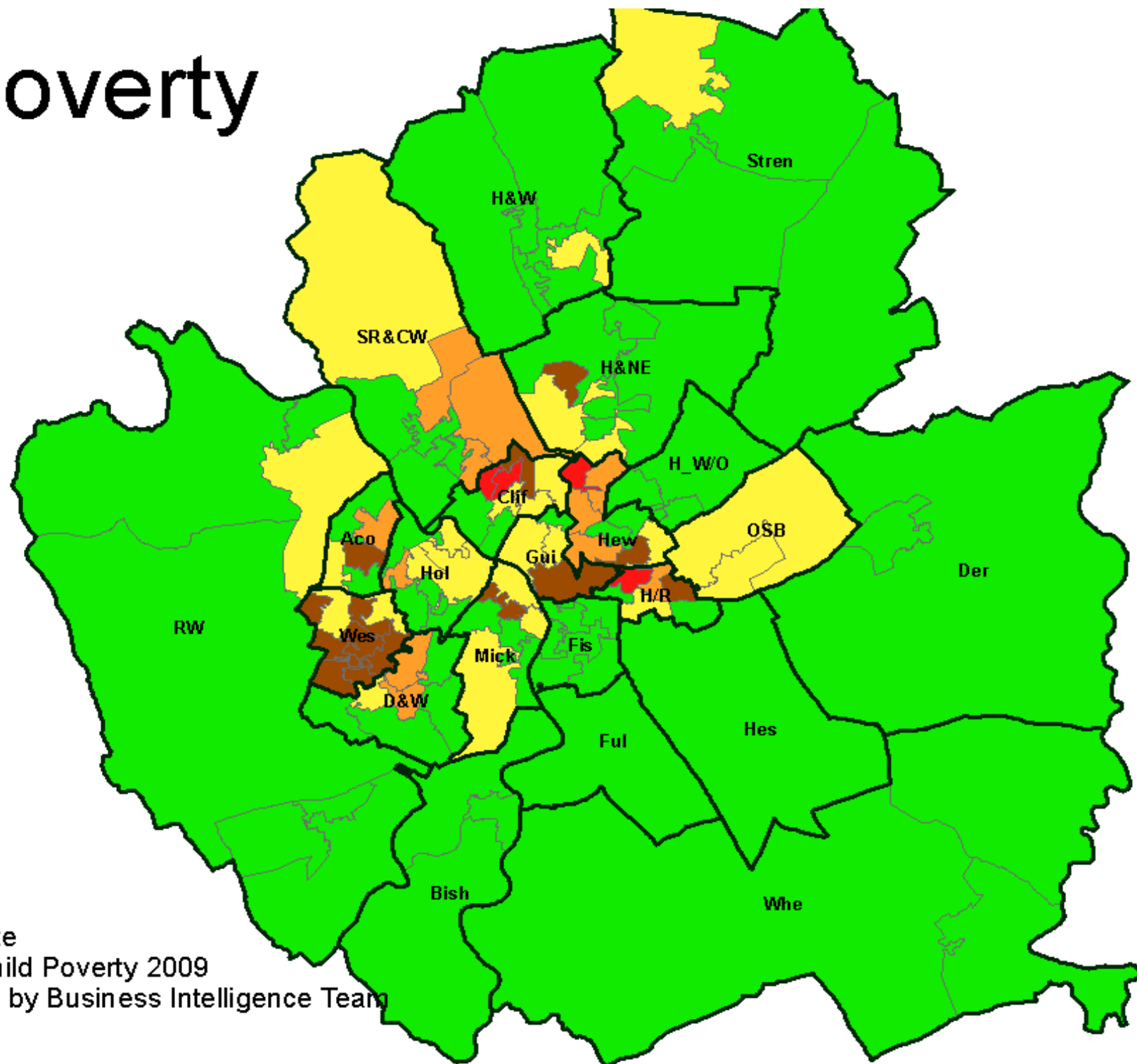
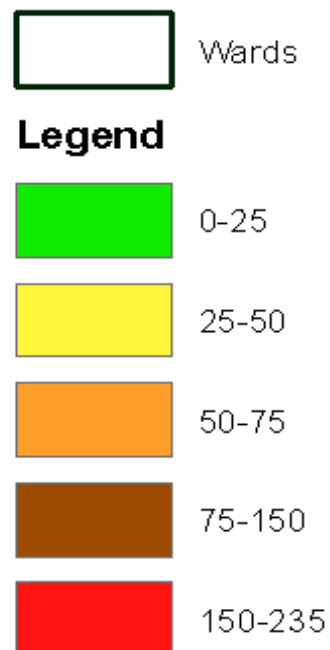
- Westfield has 850 children living in poverty which is 18.1% of all the Poverty in York (up slightly from 17.8%)

- The highest 5 wards now take up 55.8% of the total poverty in York compared to 54.9% in 2008.

- 5 wards have come down in terms of numbers (Acomb, Fishergate, Fulford, Huntington and Micklegate)

- Over a 4 year period Clifton has actually come down 2.6%

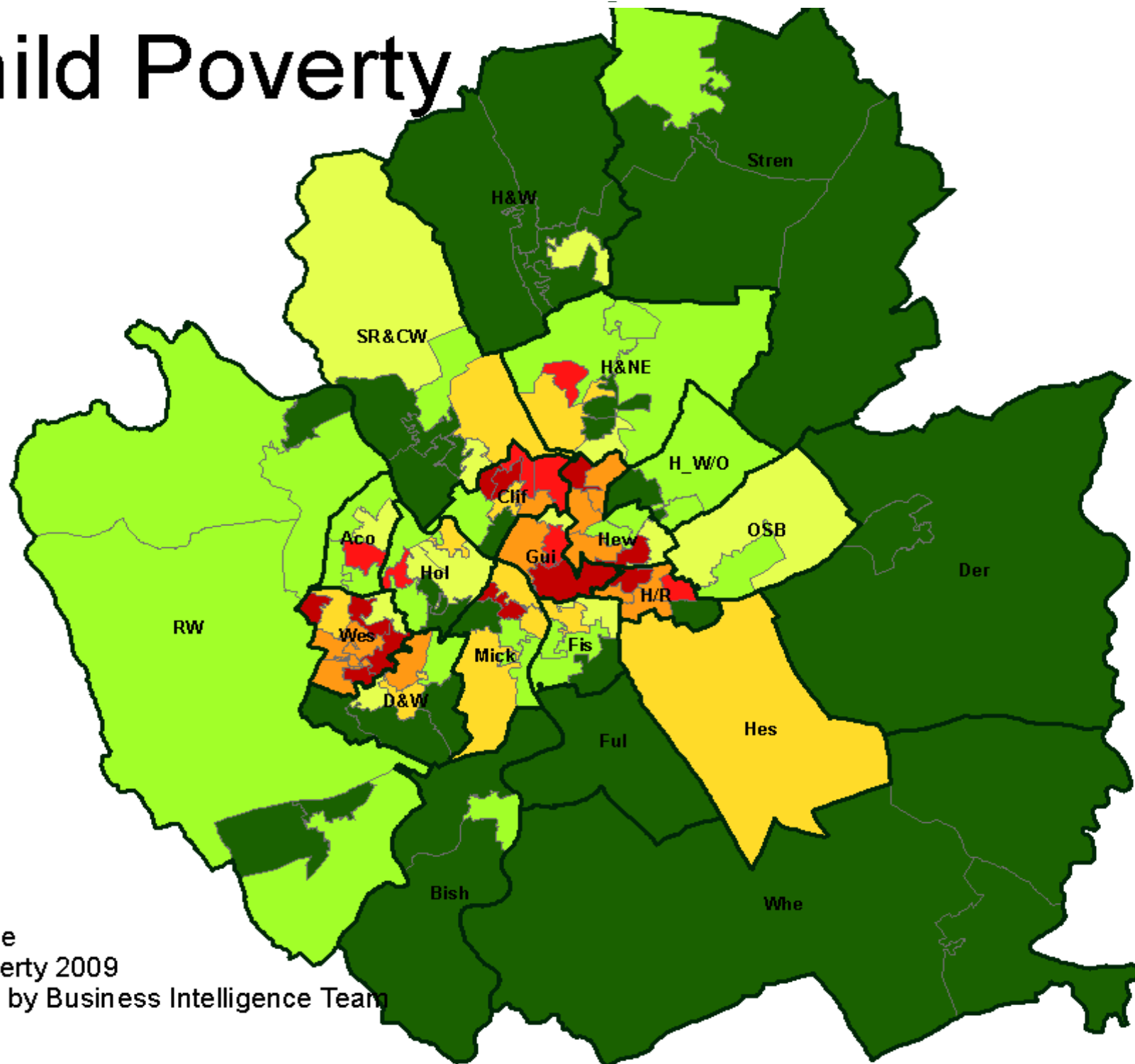
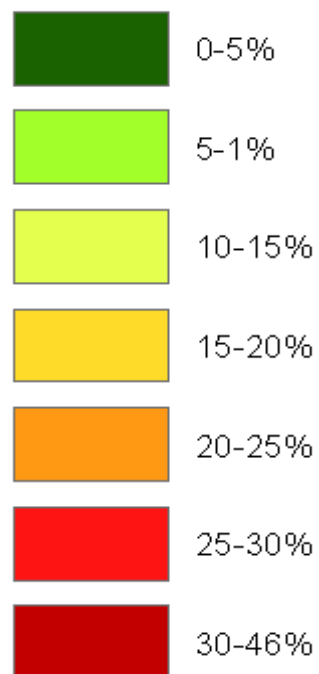

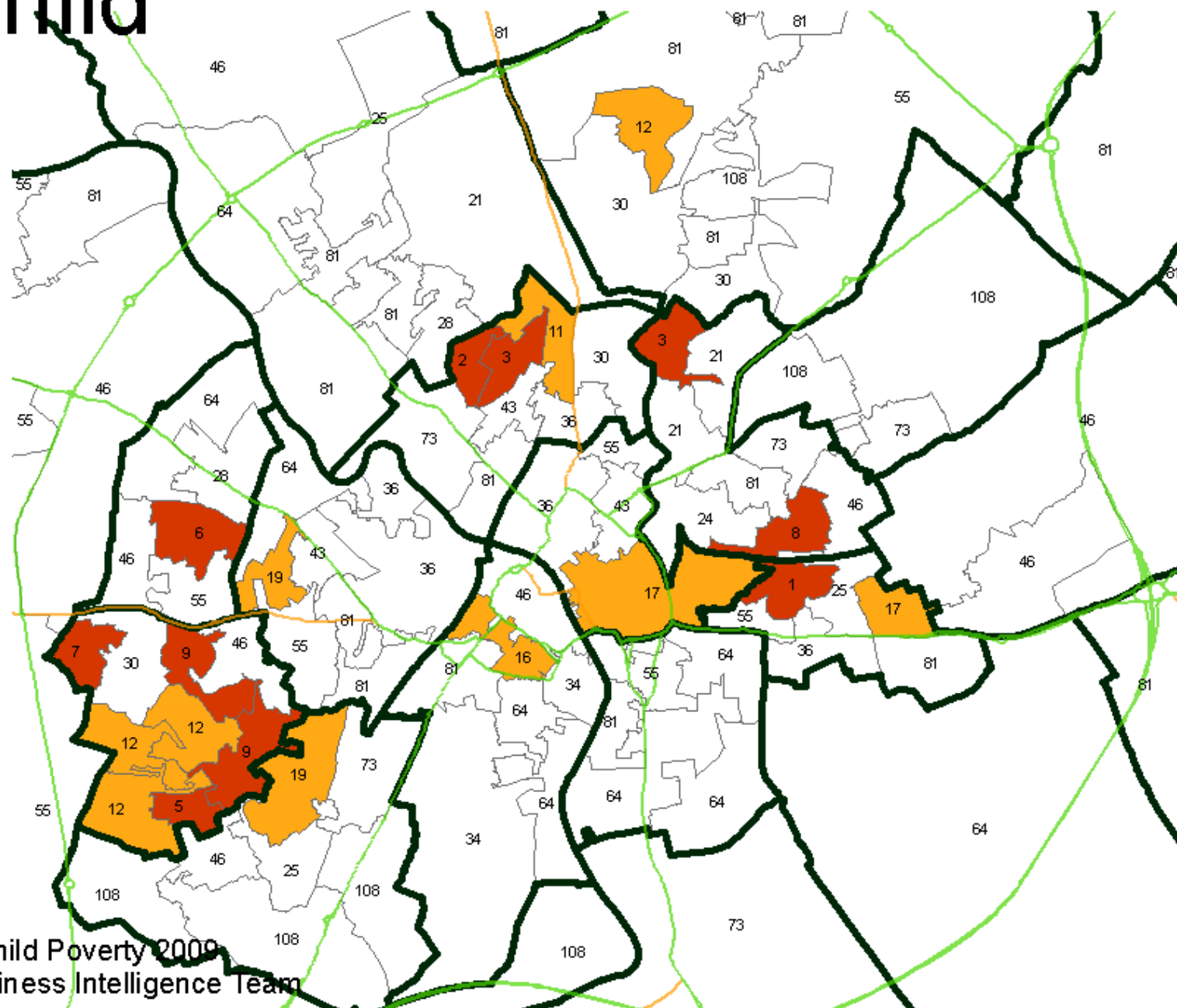
