

Admission to an Enhanced Resource Provision (ERP)

Notes for parents/carers

If you feel your child may benefit from placement at an Enhanced Resource Provision (ERP), please talk to your school's Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCo). The SENCo will consult with the Educational Psychologist (EP). Together they will consider if an ERP application would be appropriate.

1. A child seeking a place at St Paul's Nursery ERP will have significant and complex Special Educational Needs (SEN) which will benefit from further detailed assessment and intensive specialist support within a mainstream setting.
2. Primary ERPs are available in
 - a) St Oswalds' ERP for specific learning difficulties (dyslexia)
 - b) Haxby Road Academy ERP for Communication and Interaction (Speech, Language and Communication Needs)
 - c) Haxby Road Academy ERP for Communication and Interaction (Autism)

A child seeking a place at St Oswalds' ERP for specific learning difficulties (dyslexia) or Haxby Road Academy ERP for Speech, Language and Communication Needs will have an EHCP or have been assessed at SEN Support at Band 2 with a My Support Plan.

A child seeking a place at Haxby Road Academy ERP for autism is likely to have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and have a level of complexity that means their needs are best suited to an ERP

3. Secondary ERPs are available for young people with autism (including Aspergers) in
 - a) Fulford Secondary Academy
 - b) Joseph Rowntree School

A young person seeking a place at either Fulford or Joseph Rowntree ERP for Autism is likely to have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and have a level of complexity that means their needs are best suited to an ERP

Your views, as parents/carers are central to the discussion about meeting your child's needs. You can visit an ERP and see what the provision offers. Decisions about entry to an ERP cannot be made by schools; the needs of all children/young people for whom a place is being requested are considered carefully by the Education Health and Care Panel. Evidence outlining needs is collated, including their EHCP/MSP and reports from professionals working with the child/young

person. All ERP placements are reviewed regularly through the EHCP and MSP Review process to ensure they continue to be the most appropriate setting for the child or young person .
